

### Generic Competition Handbook 2025 Llawlyfr Cystadlaethau 2025

The following document outlines the generic terms and conditions for all competitions and events in Wales. For discipline-specific rules please visit the discipline handbook.

### **Competition Process**

### Entries

- 1. All entries will be submitted through Sport80 <u>Welsh Gymnastics | Login (sport80.com)</u>.
- 2. Entries will open 10 weeks before the competition date.
- 3. Entries will close 6 weeks before the competition date.
- 4. Running orders will be released 3-4 weeks prior to the competition this will be communicated to the contact who submitted the entries.
- 5. Prior to the competition, an entry may only be amended by the person making the original entry and not after 1 week before the competition.
- 6. Late entries will only be accepted up to 1 week after the closing date and at a cost of 1.5 times the entry fee (Capped at £1000).
- 7. The scores and results will be published on the WG website on the specific event page.
- 8. If a club enters a gymnast into an event, they are assumed to be confirming that the gymnast is eligible to compete (according to the rules in place). Should a gymnast be deemed ineligible prior to the event, the gymnast will not be permitted to compete, and the score will not stand (if the competition has begun). A refund will not be permitted.
- 9. When gymnasts qualify through to Welsh Finals it is the area's responsibility to send entries through to Welsh Gymnastics, this can be done manually. It is the areas responsibility to make payment once an invoice has been sent.

#### Withdrawals and Substitutions

- 1. Amendments to an entry before the closing date will not incur a penalty.
- 2. Any changes made after the closing date and up to one before the event will be accepted, any changes requested or sent in the week running up to the event will be chargeable at a cost of £10 per change.
- 3. In the case of withdrawals, the entry fee will be refunded prior to the closing date. Withdrawals will only be accepted via email. Withdrawals after the closing date will only be refunded in mitigating circumstance and with evidence provided.

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4. Should a gymnast be withdrawn after the closing date the club or coach must inform the Competition Organiser and Events Department in writing via email up to the close of registration for the relevant session.

### Spectator Tickets

- 1. Spectator tickets are currently available on Eventbrite. We will shortly be moving over to making Spectator tickets available on Sport80 <u>Welsh Gymnastics | Login (sport80.com).</u>
- 2. Spectator tickets will be available a minimum 2 weeks before the competition date. Tickets may be restricted depending on venue capacity.
- 3. Refunds will only be given where Welsh Gymnastics cancel the competition.
- 4. It is the club's responsibility to share ticket information with members.

#### <u>Judges</u>

- 1. Judges above 16 must have current membership, DBS and Safeguarding training.
- 2. Clubs are required to enter the relevant level judges for all competitions as stated in the discipline handbooks. Regional judges or above will now be required for qualifying competitions and identified pathway competitions when entering more than 3 gymnasts. This will be specified in discipline handbooks. There will be support for clubs to develop higher level judges pre the new Olympic Cycle.
- 3. Judging ratios will be identified in the discipline handbooks.
- 4. Failure to provide an adequate level or number of judges will result in a £100 fine.
- 5. All judges must adhere to their <u>code of conduct</u> and <u>member rules.</u>
- 6. All judges must be wearing appropriate clothing for all competitions above GFA this will be as per the FIG rules for the discipline. GFA will be required to wear smart casual attire.
- 7. Judges will be required to judge a full day of competition to ensure standardisation of judging.

#### <u>Volunteers</u>

- 1. Welsh Gymnastics will advertise for volunteers to support competition delivery and safe environments of competitions.
- 2. All volunteers must have current membership and be over 14 years old.
- 3. All volunteers over 16 years old must have current membership, a DBS (provided free of charge by WG) and Safeguarding Training.

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1. To enter Welsh Closed Championships as per the <u>eligibility policy</u>.


### **Qualifications and Membership**

- 1. All persons attending WG events in an official capacity, for example but not exclusive to gymnasts, coaches, judges, or TP members are required to hold current WG/BG membership in line with the level of competition entered and awards held. If it is found that a club is in breach of these, WG reserves the right to reject an entry on the grounds of gymnast safety or, if discovered post-performance, to disqualify the competitor and remove their score(s) from the official results.
- 2. For all competitions listed within the GFA section of our events offer members will need Bronze membership, all other competitions require silver membership.
- 3. Where a gymnast competes across two different disciplines, where one requires a higher level of membership, the coach will need to request judgement on a decision to enter a GFA competition, in writing using <u>competitions@welshgymnastics.org</u>. A working group will explore the options and if it is deemed the disciplines offers an advantage the request will be refused.

Clubs and recognised environments	Clubs must be current members of WG and only enter those with current membership. Entries to WG competition will be for WG or other recognised Country Governing Bodies only. Recognised environments eligible for schools and leisure competitions must be affiliated to WG to enter.
Gymnasts	Must be a current member of a WG/BG currently registered club. In exceptional cases where a gymnast is not actively attached to a registered club, they must contact <u>competitions@welshgymnastics.org</u> and complete a Non-WG Declaration. If completed the gymnast must nominate a coach and meet all other membership requirements. Gymnast membership level must be bronze for GFA identified competitions and silver for pathway competitions. Any GFA competitions will be identified within

<u>Music</u>

- 1. All music for competition routines must be uploaded on gymnast entry.
- 2. Late music submission will attract a fee of £10.00 per gymnast/group.
- 3. Music must be labelled correctly, number.name.club, any music submitted incorrectly will not be used.
- 4. All music used in event routines must conform to the relevant licensing requirements. Certain tracks belonging to Disney, Andrew Lloyd Webber and Cirque du Soleil can be used but this should be checked on the PPL website to confirm the track is included within their repertoire. To check tracks, go to <u>PPL Repertoire Search (ppluk.com</u>) and enter the artists name and title. Any music listed as part of the search can be used. If the track is not included within the listed tracks the club must apply directly to Disney, Andrew Lloyd Webber, or Cirque du Soleil to use the track and pay the relevant licensing fees.

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### Competition Day Arrangements

- 1. Coaches must make adequate provision for the supervision of their gymnasts upon arrival at the venue. Gymnasts will only be allowed to register or begin warm-up with their coach present.
- 2. Registration On arrival, any officials will need to register and collect their accreditation from registration. Only register your Gymnast(s)/Club/Region/Area when those competing in that section of the Event have arrived at the Event and intend to compete. Please inform the registration desk of any withdrawals as soon as possible. During registration, accreditation/passes will be issued. Specific registration processes, where appropriate, can be found in the event work plan.
- 3. Order of Performance The order of competing for individual events and group events shall be decided according to the competition arrangements made by the Organiser or such officials as may be authorised by the Technical Panel. To maintain the smooth and timely running of the Event, or where the safety security and good performance of the gymnasts is a concern, the TP and/or WG Competition Team reserve the right to alter the grouping of gymnasts and/or running order of performances as may be deemed necessary by the Organiser or authorised officials, up to the start of warm-up. Once underway, the order of performance will only be changed, at the discretion of the Competition Organiser, in extenuating circumstances when a gymnast may be temporarily unable to compete.
- 4. Access to Warm-up Hall -Access to the warm-up hall will be limited to the appropriate number of Coaches, Chaperones and Choreographers (where applicable) as defined in the specific details section for each Event. Judges will not be allowed into the warm-up hall once the judges' meeting has taken place.
- 5. Medal Ceremonies Except in exceptional circumstances, gymnasts who win a medal at a WG Event are expected to remain in the venue until the completion of the competition and participate in the medal presentation ceremony to collect their award in person. Attire for medal ceremonies is according to FIG World Championships and UEG rules. \*All competitions except GFA.
- 6. Tenure of Trophies All perpetual trophies remain the property of WG. Perpetual trophies are the responsibility of the winning club. The club is responsible for the inscription of, as well as safekeeping and maintenance of, the trophy and for returning it to the Organiser before the competition the following year.

### Medical and First Aid

- 1. Anyone requiring First Aid assistance should speak to the Floor Manager.
- 2. At all WG Events, an official first aid will be appointed. A physio will be present at nominated competitions and where they are, they are not able to treat pre-existing or chronic injuries. Any injury occurring during the official training or competition must be reported to the first aid/physio to ensure a record can be kept of the treatment given and by whom.

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- 3. The decision of the Floor Manager, based upon the recommendation of the WG-appointed medical officer, as to the gymnast's health and medical status and their ability to compete at the event is absolute and final.
- 4. All accident forms must be completed and registered via Sport80.

### **Protests**

- Protest will only be accepted where identified in discipline handbooks.
- Submission of unofficial photographic analysis/evidence will not be accepted at any event.
- At all competitions please do not approach the judges, and your first pint of contact should be the competition floor manager. The competition floor manager will raise any query with the head judge. Only the D (difficulty) score for any result can be queried. If a score is deemed incorrect a correction authorised by the Head judge will be made and detailed on the scoresheet, under the guidance of the Floor Manager.

#### **Safeguarding**

- 1. A nominated Safeguarding and Wellbeing Officer will be present at all WG Competitions.
- 2. All personnel must have the required safeguarding checks and training as per the member rules.
- 3. WG wants everyone to enjoy a fun, positive experience where gymnasts can fulfil their potential in an environment safe from any form of abuse. - 4. All Gymnasts must always have an accredited coach present on the competition floor. If a Gymnast attends a competition without a Supervising Coach, they will not be allowed to compete.

#### **Policies**

### Code of Conducts

- 1. Any breeches of the <u>code of conducts (coaches, staff and volunteers)</u>, <u>code of conducts</u> (<u>parents</u>) and <u>code of conducts (gymnasts</u>) will be dealt with as per the procedure.
- **2.** Any breaches to the procedures during competitions will result in a warning being given and if not, rectified individuals will be asked to leave the competition floor. If a significant breach occurs, individuals will be removed from the floor immediately.

#### **Equality**

- 2. Disability Gymnastics. The Disability competition classification categories available can be found within the information pages for each competition which has integrated disability.
- 3. Medical Information. All clubs and coaches must inform the Welsh Gymnastics competition organiser of any gymnasts with medical conditions requiring special consideration at WG events. This information should be shared with the WG competition organiser at the point of

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competition entry and will enable the WG competition organiser to make the necessary adjustments where possible to cater for the additional needs of each gymnast.

#### <u>Privacy</u>

- 1. All data will be used in line with the Privacy Notice can be downloaded <u>here.</u>
- 2. If you agree for your club to enter you into a WG competition, we will use your personal information to confirm you have been entered into the correct category and to enable you to participate in the event.
- 3. At some events, Welsh Gymnastics may produce event merchandise (e.g. event t-shirts). These may include the names and/or clubs of the gymnasts taking part.
- 4. Where competing gymnasts have a disability, it may be necessary to share the details of this disability with Performance staff and the Technical Panel to discuss if modifications to rules and processes are appropriate arising from this disability.
- 5. Please respect the privacy of all events teams and only contact them via the official channels either the personal email addresses or using <u>competitons@welshgymnastics.org</u>

### Video, Film and Photography

- 1. All WG competitions are large events where filming and photography by WG approved photographers and the media will take place. Images taken at our events may be used by WG for the purposes of promotion, education, and development of the sport. They may also be shared with relevant third-party organisations for journalistic/promotional purposes.
- 2. Any gymnast or parent who does not wish themselves or their child to be photographed/filmed at the competition must advise the Welsh Gymnastics Competition Organiser. We will ensure that any identifiable images of the participant are not published.
- 3. Any person wishing to use video, film or take photographs must abide by the WG/BG Photography at Gymnastics Events policy, which can be downloaded <u>here</u>. Photos may only be taken for personal use. Unless specifically accredited, you may not take photos for sale, other commercial use, or publication in printed or electronic form, such as on websites. Clubs may publish some photos, but this may only be done in accordance with WG/<u>BG's Safeguarding Policy</u>, and the BG Health, Safety & Welfare Policy, both of which can be downloaded <u>here</u> or the Photography Policy, linked above.
- 4. Flash photography may not be used at any time while gymnasts are warming up or competing. Follow the WG/<u>BG Photography at Event Policy.</u>
- 5. If you have concerns about the identity or actions of any photographer or believe that any unsuitable photos are being taken, you should report your concerns to the WG-appointed Safeguarding and Wellbeing Officer at the competition.

### Health & Safety

1. All competitions will be risk assessed, pre-event by the competition organiser, on the day by floor manager and everyone is responsible to report concerns and abide by policies and code of conducts.

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- 2. Our primary consideration is the health, safety, and welfare of all participants (gymnasts, coaches, and officials). All WG and BG policies and procedures (where appropriate) will be rigorously applied with regards to health, safety, welfare, and Safeguarding & Protecting Children.
- 3. All people on competition floor must adhere to the BG's Health & Safety Guidance: Safe Coaching document, which can be downloaded <u>here.</u>

Coaches	As per protocol, coaches should wear full-length tracksuit bottoms,

Hair and Jewellery	Long hair should be braided or tied back so as not to obscure vision.	
	Jewellery, body piercing and similar adornments are not allowed during	
	participation or coaching. Where unavoidable/unable to be removed,	
	suitable safe covering should be utilised, and risk assessed.	
	Suitable suite covering should be utilised, and hisk assessed.	
	Sensitivity to religious beliefs should be afforded but safety is paramount.

Performer Safety	Should at any time during a competition, a Welsh Gymnastics Floor	
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	Manager, TP member, Head Judge or National Coaching Team	
	member/employed staff, believe the elements performed put the gymnast	
	at risk, they will intervene and decide on whether the gymnast can perform	
	the skill/routine. A review and discussion with the personal coach and/or	
	club will also take place post-competition to ensure the safety and well-	
	being of all gymnasts is paramount.	
People Safety	Apart from as required for the running of the competition, anyone on	
1 1	competition floor must not use mobile phones or any other electronic	
	communication devices. It will be part of the role of the Floor Manager to	
	monitor this area.

- The person making the online entry on behalf of the gymnast(s) or club undertakes to ensure that those whom they are making an entry on behalf of are fully aware of and agree to abide by the terms and conditions of entering the competitions.
- Welsh Gymnastics retain the rights to utilise the power of discretion to ensure any judgement made is with the best interests of the gymnasts involved.

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
